The Office of Financial Aid is pleased to learn of your interest in the Master of Science in Global Health program. To assist you in the financing of your education, we are providing the following information outlining federal student aid programs.

Applying for Federal Student Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid ([FAFSA](#)) serves as the official application for federal student aid. Due to the format of the Global Health program, it is necessary to complete the 2019/2020 FAFSA for the academic year and the 2020/2021 FAFSA for the following summer. The 2019/2020 FAFSA can be completed immediately, while the 2020/2021 FAFSA should be completed after October 1, 2019. Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan Program

The William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program provides the low-interest Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan for eligible Global Health students to offset the cost of higher education. The lender is the U.S. Department of Education. The annual borrowing limit for the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan is up to \$20,500; however, students enrolled in the joint Medical Doctor/Master of Science in Global Health dual degree program may borrow up to an additional \$20,000 annually. Federal Direct Graduate PLUS Loan

The Federal Direct Graduate PLUS Loan provides a borrowing option for Global Health students. Based upon the borrower's creditworthiness, a student may borrow from this federally guaranteed, non need-based loan program.
